

We approached 2022 with eagerness to reveal our Infinity Health rebrand. On January 2, 2022, we experienced a large flood in our Leon facility which caused damage to the entire facility. We continued to serve the community despite the challenges faced since the flood in our Leon office. In some ways, our team grew closer and stronger than ever. Our level of agility persevered as we prepared for our reopening in July.

Our team displayed strength, flexibility and dexterity throughout the challenges brought on by the flood. The experience of COVID and the flood strengthened our team, who maintain high-quality care for our patients. Our team acted quickly to relocate our team members to other locations or transition their positions to remote.

In collaboration with our community partners, we identified additional needs of our communities. We provided access to additional services in many of the counties we serve in addition to expanding into new counties. We have made many communities impacts this year, including:

- Expanding our CSCBS to four additional counties.
- Growing our Access Center Mobile Response services to include Appanoose County.
- Partnering with Mt Ayr Community Schools to provide dental services.

• Supporting our Lamoni community by providing pharmacy delivery on Wednesday's. Additionally, we were honored to celebrate the retirement of Shirley Kessel and the remarkable accomplishments she made as Board Chair of Infinity Health for 17 years. ABOUT US

According to County Health Rankings (2022), the counties we serve are among the least healthy counties in the state of Iowa for health outcomes and factors (lowest quartile). Multiple economic factors impact the communities we serve, resulting in poverty rates soaring above the state average. Infinity Health, formerly known as Community Health Centers of Southern Iowa, is a community-based organization and was established in 2005 to serve the needs of the uninsured and underinsured populations in rural Iowa regardless of their ability to pay.

Since 2005, Infinity Health has expanded its services to include behavioral health, medical, dental and pharmacy and serves 11 counties within southern lowa and northern Missouri. Infinity Health is a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) and is the only FQHC in the state of Iowa that has also received the designation of being a Community Mental Health Center that we are aware of. In addition, Infinity Health submitted attestation to become a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic.





January 1st kicked off our name change from Community Health Centers of Southern Iowa to Infinity Health to encompass all that we do and who we are.

Sites and Services Expansions

Despite the challenges Infinity Health experienced with the flood on January 2, 2022 in the Leon facility, Infinity Health continued to respond to the growing needs of the communities we serve by expanding services in many locations. Team members were dispersed to other locations and all quickly jumped into action to continue to provide care to our patients. The expansions included:

- Ensuring the community received continued care and by quickly setting up the Tiny Clinic to care for our medical patients.
- Partnering with Mt Ayr Community Schools to providing dental services bi-weekly beginning September 6, 2022 at the Mt Ayr Elementary every other Tuesday.
- Identifing a need for pharmacy services on Wednesday's in Lamoni, Iowa and expanded pharmacy delivery services to meet the needs of the community beginning in July 2022.
- Building strong relationships with Lucas county Hospital, Ringgold County Hospital, Pella Regional Health Center and Knoxville Area Community Hospital to expand our Access Center services to their patients.



- Expanding our CSCBS program in the South-Central Behavioral Health Region by providing services to Appanoose, Davis, Wapello and Mahaska counties. Additionally, we were approved for two more vehicles and will utilize them in our Knoxville and Albia locations.
- Extending our Access Center Mobile Response services in Appanoose county.

Infinity Health participated in National Association of Community Health Centers' (NACHC) Cancer Transformation Project with seven other health centers. The project resulted in significant improvement in diabetes control within the communities amounting to a 46% improvement.
